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## "THOU ART THE MAN"

(II Sam. 12:7)

In II Samuel, chapter 12, we read of a very unusual, and human interest account, and yet it is as true to human nature as if it were written today. There was one of the greatest of all Israel's leaders who decided to take matters into his own hands and make "Might to be right". This man could murder his fellow man, and yet he seemed to have a heart filled with truth and compassion. Now, how can this be said of the same man?

David caused a man to be murdered and, apparently with a clear conscience, he then took the man's wife for his own. This would indicate a man without a heart, but may we take a close look at David's heart. Nathan came to him and told of a man who owned many sheep. One day this man had guests in his home and instead of killing one of the sheep from his own flock, he went to a neighbor's home, who only had one lamb, which he loved very dearly, and took this lamb and had it slain to serve his guests for food. Upon hearing of such heartless creature, David became very angry and demanded the life of a man, who would so sin against his neighbor. David had killed a man; the man of which Nathan spoke had taken and slain his neighbor's lamb. David seemed to think the sin of taking the lamb was greater than his sin, for he demanded the life of the man of whom Nathan spoke, but spoke NOTHING concerning himself.

Now, from the lips of Nathan, came words that shocked and changed the attitude and heart of a great king; "Thou art the man". Then, for the first time, no doubt, David was seeing himself as God saw him and the picture was one of horror. I am sure that you now can have a desire to condemn David for magnifying his neighbor's sins and minimizing his own; but wait just one minute. "Let him that is without sin cast the first stone", so now may we examine self.

The Bible teaches that the man who is not baptized will be lost (Mk. 16:16). We say, "What a sinner, how can anyone be so blind and stubborn as not to be baptized, does he not know he is without God and without hope"? Yes, this is true, but if you have been baptized and refuse to obey God, then read II Pet. 2:20-22

and see which is more condemned in the sight of God. The man who uses mechanical instruments to worship God, of him we say, "He cannot please God for God has not authorized such, it is not faith, so it is sin" (Rom. 14:23). Then we stay away from worship and worship God not at all. Read James 4:17 and see who has the greater sin. We say of the man who tithes, "God does not accept such offerings for this was a part of the law of Moses and this law was nailed to the cross" (Col. 2:14). Then upon the first day of the week we do not "lay by him in store as God prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2). Please read James 2:10 to see who has the greater sin the "tither" or the "short changer".

Much more could be written, but I am sure you see the point. Yes, by all means, remove the "beam" from your own eye before you try to remove the "mote" from the eye of your neighbor. David saw the "mote" in the other eye, but neither saw nor felt, the "beam" in his own eye. The next time you talk about the sins of others; stop for a minute and think, sin can keep a man out of heaven, and should God answer you, would he say, "THOU ART THE MAN". REMEMBER, WE DO NOT GO TO HEAVEN ON THE DEMERITS OF OTHERS, BUT ON OUR OWN MERITS.

## Dating and Marriage

Young Christians should be much concerned about whom they date and whom they marry realizing the seriousness and the consequences of their actions. A part of the proper training that parents should give their children is to impress upon them the importance of their marrying Christians.

Certainly this is the safe course to follow. Since dating leads to marriage the young Christian should exercise caution in his or her dating and not allow himself or herself to become too involved with an individual that would lead one away from the Lord.

In many places there are not enough young Christians to date or they may not

be attracted to each other and thus will date those who are not members of the church. In such instances young people ought to be honest with themselves and ponder such things as: Is this individual sincere, have high ideals, reasonable, openminded, interested in pleasing God? Does he or she attend services with you and indicate a desire to know something about the church or is he or she prejudiced against the church? If these questions cannot be answered favorably, such an individual is a poor risk for you even to continue to date.

Jesus taught that heaven is to be gained by a few who strive, seek and find the narrow way and who do the Father's will (Matt. 7:13, 14; Luke 13: 24; Matt. 7:21). In view of this we all need all the help we can get from this life-time companion. Such help will not and cannot come from a person who is not a Christian.

Listen, young Christian, if that boy or girl cannot be converted before marriage the odds are heavy against his or her being converted after marriage and also your making heaven your home if you marry that individual anyway. Some will say, "I will convert him later." How many do you know who have done so? On the other hand, how many do you know who have themselves become unfaithful because of such a marriage?

Consider some cases you do know about. Over the past seven years 14 young people who have at one time or another been members of this congregation have married those who are not members of the church. Of that 14 not a one, to my knowledge, has been able to convert his or her mate—there has been much unfaithfulness on the part of most of these members—at least 8 of this number do not now attend services at all (2 had quit before marriage) — there have been 3 divorces. Do you wonder why some faithful gospel preachers refuse to be parties to such marriages?

Count the cost. Is that boy or that girl you want to marry worth spending an eternity in hell for? What about children born into such a home — what chance will they have? Let that boy friend or girl friend see a real example of a Christian in you by your language and your conduct and your faithfulness—convert them first or forget them.

Let Christ guide you and the fruit of his life will be clearly seen.”

All right! I'll buy the whole package! It's Biblical. Jesus is to dwell in us. He is our personal Savior who saves us; and, he can revolutionize our life. But... what then?

Is the peace of God a principle which causes one to war against plain commands of “not forsaking the assembly.” (Heb. 10:25)? Does the personal savior “personally authorize a freedom from the following of specific commands in Christianity — which He himself made binding?” (John 14:15). Does “power through Jesus” give us the ability to detach ourselves from the guidance of bishops? (Heb. 13:17) Will “serving Christ” free Christians from giving collectively to carry on God's work? (1 Cor. 16:1,2) Has Jesus “revolutionized” so much that it is no longer a sin to go on a picnic instead of assembling with the saints? (Heb. 10:25,26)

The issue is not the “man” or the “plan.” It's not “legalism” or “liberalism.” It's not “the spirit working through the word” or “the spirit dwelling in the heart.” The decision is not “worship in spirit” or “worship in truth.” It's not “either... or.” It's “both!”

A “go-to-services-but-leave-Christ-out-on-Monday” won't work. Likewise, a “love-Jesus-but-I-could-care-less-about-church” won't work either!

The issue about what you believe is really this — what next? So you believe following commands is the way of showing Christ in your life. Do you love Him? Is He real? Is He more than a book? Then show it with the warmth of Christ's love!

So you think Jesus is better felt than told? So you feel His power “guides” your life?! Let's see you prove it through your fruits! The fruit may come from Jesus' power, and not from you — so what! The fruit still ought to be evident! (Matt. 7:20) Jesus' “fruit” never calls for less outward dedication! Where does Christian liberty free us from being as dedicated as Paul was, who though an apostle, worked under elders. (Acts

faith we are justified, Galatians 2:16. Man's capacity for such a faith is truly dynamic.

Mankind, throughout all of the ages, has groped and sought for something to believe in. Primitive people, separated from God by sin, put their faith in something tangible such as the wind which blew, the cloud which rained, or the fire which warmed. The early Greeks and Romans with all their worldly wisdom went farther in their search for faith, but they fell far short of God in conceiving of many gods with human attributes. The Hindu religion typifies a further development in its idea of never ending life. Transmigration of the soul attempts to span the gap of eternity with faith in living matter rather than God.

Modern, materialistic, Pseudo-scientific man, has accomplished little in his search for faith. Modern day literature is filled with examples of men who have put their faith in man and his ability to improve life with technological improvements. The eternal is laughed at, winked at, and largely overlooked. What belief in God we find is largely superficial.

It is my feeling that such a concept is damaging to our society, for we live in an age when insecurity prevails. Today we can expect at least 10% of children born to be treated for a mental illness during his or her life. Many of these will be church members, but their illness will be caused not by their faith, but rather by their lack of it.

From the Bible comes faith, a saving faith, true faith. Romans 10:17. It is faith containing all of the characteristics mentioned earlier and more. We receive trust in ourselves, trust in our fellow man, but most significantly, faith in the true and living God. Jesus Christ is, the "author and finisher of our faith." (Hebrews 12:2)

The first applicant was a strong-looking lad who inquired about the wages, hours, vacation . . . and then asked, "Do you provide a bicycle?"
