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Today I Saw Truth

Today I saw truth. For a moment I lived and breathed in the great presence of truth and felt its sweetness plunge deep into my soul.

I am a coach in a Junior High School. I work with 500 boys each day. This has been my occupation for over 20 years. I enjoy it

Traditionally, I am supposed to be rugged, tough, crusty; yet underneath this exterior, feeling and understanding must exist if the job is to be done.

Today was test day in climbing the rope. We climb from a standing start to a point 15 feet high. One of my tasks these past few weeks has been to train and teach the boys to negotiate this distance in as few seconds as possible.

The school record for this event is 2.1 seconds. It has stood for three years. Today this record was broken. But this is not my story. HOW this record was broken is the important thing here, as it so often is in many an endeavor in life.

For three years Bobby Palacio, a 14 1/2-year-old Mexican boy, has trained and pointed and, I suspect, dreamed of breaking this record.

In his first of three attempts Bobby climbed the rope in 2.1 seconds, tying the record. On the second try the watch stopped at 2.0 seconds flat, a record! But, as he descended the rope and the entire class gathered around to check the watch, I knew I must ask Bobby a question. There was a slight doubt in my mind whether or not the board at the 15 foot height had been touched. If he missed, it was very, very close—not more than a fraction of an inch—and only Bobby knew this answer.

As he walked toward me, expressionless, I said, "Bobby, did you touch?" If he had said, "Yes," the record he had dreamed of since he was a skinny seventh-grader and had worked for almost daily would be his, and he knew I would trust him at his word.

With the class already cheering for him for his performance, the slim brownskinned boy shook his head negatively. And in this simple gesture, I witnessed a moment of greatness.

Coaches do not cry. Only babies cry, they say. But as I reached out to pat this boy on the shoulder, there was a small drop of water in each eye. And it was

Does God Hate?

The question is asked: Can God, who is LOVE, hate? "God is love" (I John 4:8) is declared so often that many mistake Jehovah, who is gracious, kind, compassionate, and all understanding, as One so permissive He will accept anyone's terms, save everyone, condemn or judge no one.

You observe small things meticulously, giving a tenth of even your herbs, but you are careless about really important things—justice, mercy, and faith.

Many simply ignore SIN. God's unchanging hatred of sin runs all through the Bible. "Thou, God, lovest righteousness and hatest wickedness (Ps. 45:7).

God HIMSELF provides man's freedom from servitude of sin. God wants to defeat sin. He hates sin. He loves the sinner and provides a way out. "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." "God so loved . He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved . but he that believeth not is condemned already" . . . (John 3:16-18).

A Cause of Division

Much division is caused by simply adding to the word of God by practicing things not found in God's book. Sprinkling for baptism, infant baptism, most religious names, denominations, instrumental music in worship are a few examples.

II. "Just Pray Through." "Not everyone that saith unto me Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven" (Matt. 7:21). "And now why tarriest thou? arise and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16).

III. "Once in Grace, Always in Grace". "Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace" (Gal. 5:4).

IV. Women Preachers. "Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak;" (1 Cor. 14:34). "But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence" (1 Tim. 2:12).

Unity is important. Doing all things in the name of the Lord is also important (Col. 3:17). When we do ALL in the name of the Lord — by His authority — we will be united. The price for unity may be great. We may have to give up practices and beliefs which have become dear to us. But the price we pay for division is far greater, and the evils of this terrible sin must not be tolerated. We must be one in Christ. He prayed for this; He died for it; He demands it of us. Surely we love Him enough to accept the "unity of the Spirit" and KEEP it diligently (Eph. 4:3).

A Word About The Church of Christ

Throughout America many people are today asking questions about churches of Christ. The rapid growth of the church in the past few years, coupled with extensive preaching of the gospel in America and throughout the world has brought to the attention of the public those of us who call ourselves only Christians - members of the church of Christ. The nationwide Herald of Truth radio and television programs have reached into areas where the undenominational plea had not previously been heard. Similarly, the gospel has been advertised in national magazines and has reached hitherto inaccessible places. Also, an ever-increasing number of preachers have been going into mission areas both in the United States and in other countries of the world. The growth of the church has also caused many to become interested in knowing more. According to the latest volume of the World Almanac, churches of Christ now include some 2,365,500 members, dispersed through some 19,200 congregations.

There is a natural tendency to classify all religious groups into one of three categories, giving each the label Catholic, Protestant, or Jewish. It is the common practice of people of our day to classify the church of Christ as just another denomination of the Protestant group. However, the category does not fit.

We are attempting to be in truth and in fact just what people were in New Testament time-Christians, members of the Lord's church. If the apostle Paul were here today and someone should ask him if he were a Protestant, he would not understand the question. Paul never claimed to be a Protestant. He was a follower of Christ, simply a Christian.

The church, as the pillar and ground of the truth, protests just as much against Protestantism as against Catholicism or Judaism. Christ's prayer was for unity. (John 17:20-21) Religious division is a prevalent cause of infidelity. Division as it is practiced today is a mark of worldliness. (I Cor. 3:1-4) Therefore the church, if it is the church of Christ, cannot succumb to party names, to human ordinances or to the preaching of a denominational message. It is impossible for the church to perpetuate a system which necessarily causes and cements division and discord. There are points of similarity between the church which Christ established and modern-day Protestantism, but the church is not Protestant. It is the undenominational church of the living God.

Churches of Christ have no creed, except the inspired word of God. No conferences or conventions are held to draw up, or to revise the doctrines of the church. Each of the thousands of the congregations is autonomous, guided only by the Bible. Churches of Christ, in the absolute sense, do not teach anything; they simply hear and heed the teachings of Christ. We are endeavoring to be a part of Christ's church and encourage all men to join with us in going back to his church, the only church that has the promise of God's approval and of salvation in the great day of judgment.

Evolution and Christianity

Evolution Versus Christianity

In the October "71" issue of the Christian Herald (The counterpart to Christianity Today among protestant denominationalism), Louis Cassels wrote an informative and, in the main, good article concerning obstacles the Church had to overcome in its growth. Of course, Cassel being a member of protestantism, said many things with which I naturally could not agree, but he said one very unnatural thing with which I register an emphatic disagreement. In his article he states that Darwin's theory of evolution only "seemed to contradict the story of man's creation. Thus, evolution . . . has turned out to be a potent, rational support for Christian belief in a creator." Cassels may not be a believer in evolution but his remarks might be taken as if he were.

I would like to adduce the following statements of men who are scientifically qualified to speak on the subject of God. man and evolution. I ask the reader to compare these statements with those of Cassels.

Dr. Harry Rimmor states, essentially, what evolutionists believe concerning what Moses meant when he penned Gen. 1:26, 27. When Moses wrote that God created man, he was simply telling of man's "metamorphesis from worms into human beings" (The Harmony of Science & Scripture, p. 66). Rimmer also says, "for every fact and proof that militates against the truth of the theory of organic evolution (as postulated by Darwin. MLW) is a tremendous argument in favor of the fact of special creation" (The Theory of Evolution And The Facts of Science, p. 44). To admit evolution is to falsify special creation as revealed in Genesis 1. Darwin's "theory of evolution leads to such consequences as Nazism" (Paul A. Zimmerman, P.H.D., A Synposium on Creation, p. 77). Dr. Henry M. Morris says, "that no compromise with the standard evolutionary chronology, either for the earth as a whole or for man in particular, is possible at all ... evolutionary framework...proved false" (Biblical Cosmology and Modern Science, p. 68). "Evolution contradicts the theory of uniformitarianism, the first law of thermodynamics, and the second law of thermodynamics; Theistic evolution contradicts the Bible" (Otis Gatewood, LL. D., There is a God In Heaven, pp. 230-232,237). "Evolution is basically anti-Christian" (John C. Whitcomb, Th.D., and H. M. Morris, The Genesis Flood, pp. 440-442). The theory of evolution is not logical nor agreeable with
