After the great call 'Come over into Macedonia" had been answered by the apostle Paul. his first opportunity to 'help us' was presented by Lydia and the Women which 'resorted thither'. Outside Phillipi. the apostle preached for the first time on European soil, and Lydia became the first European convert to the cause of the Lord. As far as salvation is concerned, this case is of no more importance than the conversion of Saul, of the Eunuch, of the household of Cornelius, or those on the day of Pentecost. The outstanding point of discussion is 'whose heart the Lord open. ed'. The fact that the Lord opened her heart is sufficient for some to launch out and preach salvation poured out upon the slien sinner separate and apart from all Gor's commands and the sinner's obedience.

The heart was so important in the plan of salvation that the Lord opened it The church of Christ has no reason to deny this. it behooves us rather to teach how the Lord operates upon the heart o: m n.

## CHURCH HISTORY by Clovis Ragsdale Moten

We closed our last article on church history with a study of the establishment of the church on the day of the first penticost after the resurrection. In this issue we shall study the church in the days of the apostles. First we need to understand how the church grew and worshipped in the days immediately after its establishment In Acts 6;7 we are told that thechurch grew in great numbers and many of the Jewish priests became obedient to the faith.

and finally succeeded in putting the Saviour to death began to persecute the church which up to this time was in Jerusalem only. We read in Acts 8 of the efforts of Saul of Tarsus and other powerful Jews who made great havoc of the church. Because of this the church was scattered from Jerusalem in the regions round about Jerusalem, into Samaria, and all Judea. In the meantime Saul of Tarsus was converted. Through his efforts much of the Gentile world was to hear the story of the cross.

The door of the church was opened to the Gentiles by Peter at the conversion of Cornelius eight years after the about The church was e tablished. church grew with leaps and bounds as the apostles and other able men went in all directions declaring the simple story of the cross and establishing congregat ions of the church in many places.
