We notice in the daily newspapers that a professor was dismissed from one major Christian college because of liberal attitudes concerning Bible matters. We are glad to see the men who serve on the Board of Trustees of our Christian schools taking action on those who are edging away from Bible truths and gradually planting their ideas in the mind of the young. Liberalism is one of the first steps to apostacy and unless it is dealt with in its early stages, it can destroy the church. Most of the battles within our own ranks have been fought with the ultra-conservative over methods as to how the church was to carry out its responsibility of of teaching and helping the needy. Most of the brotherhood may be ill prepared to meet this new challenge.

Liberalism is hard to pin down. Their ideas seem to be very flexible. They think of the Bible as a book of generalities and that it is not to be taken specifically. The more liberal do not believe in the Virgin birth, the experiences of Jonah, and explain many of the miracles as natural phenomena. They do not seem to realize that if you can disprove some portions of the scriptures, you can disprove all.

Unless our Christian colleges can stop this liberal movement, they will loose the support and confidence of much of the brotherhood, and worse, they will be promoting a possible division of the body of Christ.

The constant dissent of our youth against Law and Order is disturbing to Christians. The Bible plainly teaches Christians to be content and to obey the laws of the land. When Christ was in the world there was social injustice and poverty. He refused to lead the Jews out of their political and social problems, explaining that

his kingdom was not of this world. On another occasion he said that the poor would be with us always. It would seem that man would never be able to settle all the social and economical problems. If he could he would be able to establish something of a "heaven on earth". We fear that many today are more interested in their present physical needs and too little concerned about the eternal. Man only lives for about 70 years. Eternity is endless. Our spiritual needs are what we should be stirred up about, and to try to do something about that which is most important. This is something we should think about.

I DON'T WANT TO BE A "WATCHDOG"

To deny that there is a liberal element in the church today is to be naive. To ignore it is folly. To be unconcerned about it is inexcusable.

Strange as it may seem though, to speak out against it is to be branded by some with undesirable labels. Lately the following terms have been used quite freely to describe brethren who are concerned about liberalism: "self-appointed watchdogs", "witch-hunters", and "keepers of orthodoxy." Such intimidation is designed to silence sentinels who see danger approaching.

Quite frankly, I don't want to be a watchdog. Neither is it my desire to be a witch-hunter. And if a "keeper of orthodozy" means to be a champion of human traditions then I don't want to be that either. I love my brethren and don't want to stand in judgment of any.

But at the same time, I know where I stand and am not ashamed of it. To the best of my ability, I try to stand four-square for the truth of God's word. I want to do it as lovingly and as kindly as I know how, and yet uncomprisingly.

Since this is my position, and that of

countless other gospel preachers, may I ask what we are supposed to do when we hear and read things that do not befit sound doctrine? Are we to sit idly by and practice tolerance to the sacrifice of truth?

When we hear so-called gospel preachers quote more from men than from the Bible are we to be unconcerned? When we hear that the church is a denomination and that there are Christians in all churches and that our preaching has been hard, narrow, and legalistic, are we to sit silently? When we hear the church castigated repeatedly are we not to offer any defense? When digressive positions on instrumental music and the Lord's supper are advocated are we to roll over and play dead? When the socail gospel begins to take precedence over the gospel of salvation are we to acquiesce? When liberals distinguish between loyalty to Christ and loyalty to His word are we to give assent? When the King James and American Standard translations of the Bible are made fun of while the "Good News For Modern Man'. version is extolled are we not to be concerned? When it becomes obvious that some pride themselves in being "unorthodox and far-out" and give every indication of an intent to "restructure" the church are we to forget loyalty to truth and just surrender?

I am reminded of king Ahab when he asked Elijah, "Art thou he that troubleth Israel?" Elijah answered, "I have not troubled Israel, but thou....in that ye have forsaken the commandments of the Lord." I Kings 18:17-18.

Let me say it plainly—Those of us who are insisting on the importance of adherence to God's word and the preaching thereof without compromise are not troubling the church today—the ones troubling the church are the "strange talking" liberals. I don't want to be a watchdog, but neither can I sit by silently and not warn brethren of the liberal trends and where they will take us.

tian life. He came to teach men to live as children in the presence of the Father and not to be slaves, cringing before a despot. One of the ways "the abundant life" becomes a reality is by seeing the needs, problems and failures of others, not with the eye of selfrighteousness but through the eyes of compassion, love, and sympathy.

THE DIVINE EXAMPLE

Jesus loved people. He was always falling into conservation, sometimes in complete disregard of the laws of custom. When his disciples returned to him at the well of Samaria, they were surprised to find him talking with a woman. Society had agreed to ostracize certain classes, but this was not the practice of the Saviour. Jesus came "to seek and save the lost" (Luke 19:10), and by his activity incurred the sneer of being a "wine-bibber and a glutton". He wanted men to live as neighbors and brothers, and set the example.

The apsotle Paul was not one man, but many. He states this when he says, "Unto the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might gain them that are under the law: to them that are without law, as without law (being not without law to God, but under the law to Christ), that I might gain them that are without law. To the weak became I as weak, that I might gain the weak: I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some."
(1 Cor. 9:20-22). His ability to understand did not come as a result of gritting his teeth, but by opening his heart to the spirit of Christ.

Spirituality, culture, and wisdom are not weak, but strong because they seek to solve problems rather than make them; "The wisdom that is from above," James says, "is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy." (James 3:17). In many instances, envy and strife between brethren come not because of basic differences on principles, but from an exaggerated sense of self-importance and an unwillingness to understand the other's point of view.

DIVINE RESULTS

When genuine understanding and sympathy characterize our lives, many beneficial results naturally follow. It will help

in making us fair. The apostle Paul, in stating the position of his opponents, always was objective and factual. He answered clearly and decisively their arguments, without resorting to demogoguery or misrepresentation. Patience is compelled by understanding, because we seek the best in others rather than to glory in love for God and spiritual matters also causes the Christian to have a different attitude toward other men. Feelings of envy, hatred and jealousy which were a part of his previous life are gone. In their place is a feeling of sincere love which causes him to wish for the other person the very same good fortune he desires for himself. In other words, he loves his neighbor as himself. (Matt. 22:39).

Fifth, the person in Christ has new interests to engage his attention and to employ his energies. Worldly interests and material affairs may well be the center of one's life outside of Christ, but in Christ the church and its affairs are to be the center of the new creature's thoughts, words and deeds. If the church is not this important to him, he needs to make it so! For the church is the body of Christ. (Col. 1:18). Therefore the work of the church is the work of Christ. To work in the programs of the church is to serve Christ through the church.

How does one share this new life? How can one be made anew? According to II Corinthians 5:17, being a "new creature" depends on being "in Christ." To be "in Christ" is to be related to him so that he is one's Saviour. This relationship is established in only one way. Paul declared that men are baptized into Christ. "Or are ye ignorant that all we who were baptized into Christ did put on Christ." (Ga. 3:27). Are you numbered among God's new men?
