WHAT IS THE CHURCH OF CHRIST?

SALVATION

Many things have been stated in God's word as conditions of salvation that before one is saved from alien sins these conditions have to be complied with in order to be freed from sin. I want to call your attention to these conditions that have been given by our Lord Jesus Christ for salvation. Hence it is an impossibility according to the word of God for one to be saved from sin without meeting each and everyone of these conditions given by the Christ We cannot take any one of the commands that has been given and contend that we are saved by it alone. Thus faith is a command given that one must believe before salvation is obtained. Jesus said for if ye believe not that 1 am he, ve shall die in your sins. Jno. 8:24. But who believes that faith only is required by the Son of God? If that is all Christ requires of one to be saved from sin then why command other things? If faith only saves then the devil will be saved, for they believed and trembled, Jam. 2:19. Who believes that devils will be saved? If faith only saves then devils will be saved for James said that they believed. Yes, you know that almost every day you will hear some preacher tell you all you have to do to become a child of God is just believe. If one is saved at the point of faith as some contend then, the believer cannot be given the power to become he already is. For instance, could I be given the right of power to

become the son of my mother? When I am already her son? That is an impossibility for me to become what I already am. Therefore if one is a child of God at the point of faith, then the believer could not be given the power and right to become what he already is. Yet the Son of God said in Jno. 1:12, but as many as received bim, to them gave he power to become the sons of God even to them that believe on his name. If one believes with all of his heart that Jesus is the Christ the Son of God and is trying to complete the command that has been given, nothing will be able to prevent that one from complying to the command. There is no argument over faith, all will agree that we must believe in order to be saved, Heb. 11:6. But the difference arises at what point is one saved. As you will note it cannot be the moment faith has been produced is one saved. But the faith that saves is a working faith, one that takes Christ at his word and is willing to do what has been commanded. Paul said though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains and have not charity, I am nothing, 1 Cor. 13:2: And James said for as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also. Jam. 2:26.

There are those who tell us that salvation is by faith only, and no work what act is to be performed by the one who believes. Yet Paul said if he had all faith and no more it profited him nothing. And James said if it didn't work it was a dead faith.

I and all of my brethren believe and teach that salvation is by faith, but we do not believe and teach that one is saved at the point one believes or by it only. But every act that is to be done must be done by faith. Even faith itself is termed a work by our Lord Jesus Christ. When the people wanted to know, what shall we do, that we might work the work of God, that ye might believe on him whom he hath sent. Jno. 6:28-29. In answer to the people when they wanted to do the work of God. Christ told them plainly that faith in him was a work. This work had to be done by some one other then God. God or Christ neither could do their believing. But something they themselves had to do. So it is with people today, there is something for them to do, I cannot believe for you neither can you for me.

Won't you think my dear friends of your souls well being? Some day we shall stand before our master to give account of ourselves to him. How sad will it be when the book shall be opened and find you haven't done what he has told you to do. It will be too late then to do anything about it. Now is the time to make ready for that day.

CHURCHES OF CHRIST

Though these churches are all free and independent of any general hierarchy, each local congregation having elders to oversee its affairs and deacons to assist them, yet they are united in a common faith and voluntarily cooperate in sending missionaries and in doing benevolent work under the direction of local churches. Membership depends on only (1) faith in and confession of Jesus Christ as the Son of God; (2) repentance from sin; (3) baptism by immersion. Their worship consists of the five acts specifi cally authorized by the New Testament: (1) reading and preaching the Bible; (2) observing the Lord's Supper as a memorial; (3) contributing money to the Lord's work; (4) praying; (5) singing (a capella) psalms, hymns, spiritual songs.

In faith and practice they date back to the founding of the church of the New Testament on the first Pentecost after Jesus' resurrection. They call for a complete return to the New Testament, and seek to restore in their worship, organization, and life the pattern of New Testament Christianity. Rejecting all party names, creeds and organizations in their abhorrence of divisional denominationalism in Christendom, they plead for unity of all believers on the basis of the Bible alone.

The very nature of this fellowship of free Christians makes it impossible to trace without interruption specific groups back to the day of Pentecost. It is known that during the 17th century there were churches of Christ in England. Late in the 18th century a restoration movement swept over the

United States and resulted in a rapid growth of such churches. In at least six different sections of the new nation men independently began to preach a return to the Bible, urging their hearers to become Christians only, and not to affiliate with any sect. In 1860 these churches counted 192,323 members; by 1875 there were some 400,000 members. In the last quarter of the 19th century there came a division. The tide of liberalism, later known as modernism, began to sweep many leaders away from a fundamental faith in the New Testament as an all - sufficient guide in matters of faith and practice. The simplicity of both the organization and the worship of many churches was changed by the institution of an over all missionary society to control the mission work of the brotherhood and by the introduction of mechanical instruments of music into the worship. These innovations were followed by open membership, modernistic theology, clericalism, and ecclesiasticism. The fundamental difference developed in the attitude toward the Bible as divine authority. A majority of the churches digressed from the original position and formed the denomination of the Disciples of Christ (q. v.) By 1906 this division was complete and was recognized by the Bureau of the Census.

Since then the churches of Christ have increased rapidly. Missionaries are supported in Germany, the Netherlands, Belgium, France, Italy, England, Australia, South Africa, Mexico, China, Japan, the Phillipine Islands, Hawaii, Cuba and Alaska. There are 44 churches in Great Britian, 75 in Canada, ten in Germany, one in Switzerland, two in Belgium, eight in Italy, one in France, six in Australia, 12 in South Africa, and ten in India. In the United States there are churches in every state of the union. As of 1950 there were 11,760 churches with a membership totaling 814,200.

As of 1950, there were in the United States, 16 colleges and high schools controlled and supported by members of the church as individuals, 15 homes for the aged and for orphans and 45 periodicals published by individual members (Encyclopedia Americana, Volume 6, page 662.)

constant efforts to teach the sinner the way of salvation is emphasied many times. These people in the New Testament times were called the church. Would not people today who practice the identical same things as those people did, be the church that God would recognize today. Remember that God gave the plan to mankind.

No where in all of the New Testament can there be found where one was used in worship, while the command to sing is stated. 1 Cor. 14:15; Ehp. 5:19; Col. 3:16,17. By not using the instrument we can be absolutely safe, to use it would be taking a chance of being in open rebellion to Gods plan that he gave. On this and many other issues the church differs from all the other churches in the world today. Why take a chance with loosing your soul by trusting in man made institutions, when it is possible to worship God in the way he established? Speak where the Bible speaks and be silent where the Bible is silent is the way thats right and cannot be wrong.

AN OPEN LETTER TO THE COMMUNITY CHEST

Many of this country's finest men gave their lives in battle that this country might be preserved against dictatorial methods and American freedom might live. It is regretful that some overzealous workers for money raising organizations have disregarded the American way of freedom.

Many people are threatened with losing their jobs if they fail to give to an organization that others think they should support. Promotions are jeopardized and workers intimidated and embarrassed if they refuse to "Give a day's pay: it's the American way." The American way is freedom—freedom to give, or not to give.

Who in his right mind could ask a Jew to give to a religious organization opposed to Judaism? Who in the name of consistency could ask a Protestant to financially assist a Catholic organization inasmuch as the very word Protestant means 'in protest to Catholicism"? Why should a Catholic give to aid groups opposed to her, and relegates all Catholies to hell? The Community Chest blatantly asks Jews to help the Chest they deny; the Protestant to help those they protest against; and the Catholics to protest against themselves. Three religious organizations diametrically opposed to each other. Yet Community Chest zealots dictate and demand workers to give a day's pay!

Remove every organization from the Community Chest list that has any connection with any religious group and then all could give to it. The American way of freedom must be maintained! Americans must be free to give or refuse to give without fear of retribution. The business concerns that pressure to obtain a "100% gave" report and those that automatically deduct a day's pay without the worker's consent are dictatorial and un-American. —Selected

THE JEWISH SYNAGOGUE

Somewhere during the years of Babylonian captivity the synagogue made its appearance. The law of Moses did not command it; nothing like it is to be found in the detailed instruction of the five books of Moses.

Yet somewhere in the law the Jews found authority for the synagogue? Where? In the commands of that law to teach. They understood full well the obligation to teach their own children at home, but they had the synagogue as well, to supplement the teaching done in the home by parents. No Jew ever had the idea that the synagogue was a sinful institution, just because he was told to teach his own children at home Instead, he took advantage of the instruction offered there so his children

might be schooled in the law of God.
