The church of Christ has had its problems in the twentieth century. Sommerism and its "anti" Christian college views; the cup question; the class question; the premillenial question; the located preacher question; the cooperation question as it relates to churches and the Herald of Truth principle; and, today, the most potentially dangerous problem of all, the Holy Spirit question.

Since the discussion of the Holy Spirit through the pages of the Firm Foundation in 1966 and 1967 by J. D. Thomas, J. W. Roberts, and Foy E. Wallace, Jr., much has been said; not all

of it for the good.

On the one hand there are many Christians, both young and old, who, in their study of the Holy Spirit have come to believe that the Holy Spirit can be prayed for and that He will come in-to the person, take up residence, and work miracles (such as: "new" healings, and extra-revelational guidance); but, on he other hand there are many Christians, both young and old, who, in their study of the Holy Spirit, have come to believe that the Holy Spirit dwells in the Christian representatively and commensurately to the amount of Scripture known and obeyed by the Christian.

With these two views represented there is yet a third view which is represented by many Christians, both young and old, who, in their study of the Holy Spirit, have come to believe that the Holy Spirit cannot be invited to take up residence in a Christian by prayer, nor does He dwell in a Christian strictly tantamount to the Scripture known and obeyed-but, the Holy Spirit takes up an actual, literal residence as a Holy Guest in the Christian upon his being immersed, and that the Holy Spirit functions in the Christian not separate and apart from the Scripture, but in addition to the Scripture.

It seems to this writer that the first two views are far too extreme. (Cf. On the first view Pat Boone's, A New Song (Carol Stream, Ill.: Creation House, 1970), James D. Bales', Pat Boone and the Gift of Tongues (Searcy, Ark.: James D. Bales, 1970), and Jimmy Jividen's, Glossolalia from God or Man (Fort Worth, Tx.: Star Bible Pub., 1971). On

the second view Foy E. Wallace, Jr.'s, The Mission and Medium of the Holy Spirit (Foy E. Wallace, Jr., Pub., 1967). The third view seems to be the Biblical view. (Cf. James D. Bales', The Holy Spirit and the Christian (Shreveport, La.: Gussie Lambert Pub., 1966), J. W. Robert's, "The Indwelling of the Holy Spirit," Firm Foundation (Austin, Tx.: Firm Foundation Pub. House, Jan. 24, 31; Feb. 7, 14, 1967), and Roy H. Lanier Sr.'s, "The Spirit and the Word," Firm Foundation (Ibid., Nov. 10, 1970), p. 13, , "The Holy Spirit," Firm Foundation (Ibid., Jan. 5, 12, 19, 26;

Feb. 16, 1971).

It is Biblically evident that the Holy Spirit does actually dwell in a Christian: God gives to the obedient the Holy Spirit (Acts 5:32); the seven men chosen to serve tables were men "full of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 6:3); "the Holy Spirit was given unto us" (Rm. 8:9, 11); "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit which is in you" (I Cor. 6:19); Paul reminded the Galatians that they had "received the Spirit" (Gal. 4:6); "the Holy Spirit dwelleth in us" (II Tim. 1:14); God abideth in us, "by the Spirit which He gave us" (I Jh. 3:24); God "hath given us of His Spirit" (I Jh. 4:13; and Cf. Eph. 3:16, 20; 4:30; 6:18; Philip. 2:13; Col. 1:11, 29; and, Jude 20. The exact "how" the Holy Spirit dwells in a Christian is infinitely hidden. The functions of the Holy Spirit, however, are revealed: "the Spirit Himself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are children of God" (Rm. 8:16); "by the Spirit ye put to death the deeds of the body" (Rm. 8:13); ye are "sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise" (Eph. 1:13); the Holy Spirit is an "earnest of our inheritance" (Eph. 1:14); God abides in us, "by the Spirit" (I John 3:24; Eph. 2:22); and, The Holy Spirit produced Spiritual fruit in the Christian's life. (Gal. 5:22, 23).

One cannot emperically know that the Holy Spirit dwells and operates in him, but he can Biblically know it! It has been the experience of this writer to talk with certain ones who believe in an emperical knowledge of the Spirit's indwelling and operation. They told this writer that there was nothing greater than the "infilling of the Holy Spirit". They commented further that their experience

The Conversion of Cornelius

The tenth chapter of Acts records the conversion of the first Gentile to become a Christian and for that reason, if for no other, should prove interesting to all of those who read this paper.

As members of the Gentile race of people and having many blessings of the age in which we live, we sometimes forget that once there was a time when our race did not enjoy the blessings and privileges that are ours to have. Time was when only the Jew was privileged to call God, Father, but this came to an end after the death of Jesus upon the cross, where he died for all men, regardless of race or color. This had been prophesied by the prophets. See Isiah 2:2-3, Micah 4:1-2; Ezekiel 17:22, and many others to be found in the Old Testament as well as Christ himself. Matt. 21:33-44.

What was this first Gentile to become a Christian like? First we are told that he was an officer in the Italian or Romar army, holding the rank of Captain. In the second verse of Acts 10, we learn that he believed in God and is described as a man of many good works, giving alms to the poor and as a man who prayed to God always. Some today would say that this man was already a Christian and had nothing to fear in judgment. If living a good moral life will be sufficient to go to heaven, then Cornelius was safe. Yet we find that God made known to this man that he must send men to Joppa and call for one Simon, whose surname was Peter, who would tell him what he cughtest to do. The fact that he was told that there was something for him to do proves beyond a doubt that he was not saved in the sight of God. Remember that Jesus promised Peter in the sixteenth chapter of Matthew that he would be allowed to open the keys of the kingdom. This was fulfilled to the Jews on the day of Pentecost as recorded in the second chapter of Acts. Here in the tenth chapter of the same book we learn that the same Peter is for the first time telling a Gentile what he must do to become a Christian. It took quite a bit of trouble on the part of God as well as for Cornelius to bring this Gospel preacher into his presence. Peter was doubtful of the meaning of the trance that God caused to come upon him in which he was showed. Cornelius had to send men after Peter. Peter had to make the journey which amounted to about thirty miles. Why was all this necessary? We are told today by many preachers that all one must do to be saved is just get down by their radios and pray through, while others say we can be saved out in the fields by ourselves. In all of the

A Message to Our Generation

"At a time when our society desperately needs mature leadership and guidance, many capable older people are shirking their responsibilities because they are intimidated by the youth cult," charges Dr. William Banowsky, president of prestigious Peppersine College in Malibu, California.

"Instead of assuming their natural roles as teachers for the young, many highly qualified adults simply drop out. Others make pitiful attempts to leap the age barrier by affecting the dress, speech and mannerisms of the 'Now' generation," he told the ENQUIRER.

"As a result, radical youngeters who haven't lived long enough to acquire either wisdom or judgment are stepping into the vacumn and emerging as sages of our time," said Dr. Banowsky who, at 36 is one of the country's youngest college presidents.

"Many parents really believe their children are smarter than they are—perhaps because kids have achieved a sort of super sophistication from watching television or from the other mass madia.

"But this is not the n-depth wisdom that comes from experience. There are some lessons that only time can teach. There's no book or documentary that can equal the experience of actually living an event." Adults have no reason to apologize for what they've done when the young attact the Establishment, he said, "We must forget this nonsense about the 'Now' generation," he added with some anger.

anger.

"Middle-aged Americans advanced civilization in this country and the world farther than any other generation in history. So why are we apologizing to a generation that has accomplished nothing."

"The 'Now' generation didn't develop space technology, put men on the moon, develop the Salk polio vaccine or advancemedical science. "And the over-40 set has raised the working man's standard living to the highest in the world, and has built libraries, schools and social programs that make it possible for everyone to get an education regardless of race or economic class.

"Our older generation should be passing on their wealth of knowledge to the young instead of feeling guilty because they are growing old," he said. Adults must first accept their responsibility to understand the young and then to lead them.

"We can't expect children to understand us anymore than we understood our own parents," he pointed out. "It is easier for a man of 50 to understand his 20-year-old son than it is

New Testament we have no example of anyone being saved without first being told words whereby they might be saved.

When Peter arrived, and began to teach those assembled how that God had sent Christ into this world and of the many things that he did and how that he was put to death and raised again the third day, the Holy Spirit fell on them as it did on the Jews at Pentecost. WHEN WE FEEL TOO IMPORTANT, LET US TAKE A LOOK AT GOD AND HIS WORKS

We are one of about three and a half BILLION (3,500,000,000) people on this planet. God is said to have at least one hundred Billion other stars and planets in His galaxy! Nine of these planets revolve around the sun. The nearest of these planets to the earth, is the moon, which ranges from 221, 463 to 252,710 miles from us. The distance from the earth to the sun, varies from 91,500,000 to 94,500,000 miles and the sun is 865,000 miles in diameter! this is small compared to Jupiter, which is 1,300 times larger than the earth and is 367 million miles away. But Jupiter is a close neighbor, compared to some stars which are said to be 24 trillion miles away (24,000,000,000,000). Still feel important?

THE EARTH

Our planet earth is 7,927 miles in diameter; 24,860 miles in circumference and has a surface of 196,970,980 sq. miles. It rotates (counter-clockwise) each 23 hours, 56 minutes and 4.09 seconds. At the same time it is in orbit around the sun and completes the orbit in 365 days, 6 hours, 9 minutes and 11 seconds. It is traveling through space at the speed of 18 miles a second, 64,800 miles an hour. Yet Pluto is so far away 2,670,000,000 miles, that it takes it 248.4 years to orbit the survey Survey quowwey far away that they are measured in light-years. Which means how far light can travel in a year at the speed of 186,273 miles per second! Only 17 stars are said to be less than 12 light-years away! Some are 1 billion, 600 million

light-years away! Too far to walk! Does this sound like that man has "conquered" space?

GOD

Some where in this vast space is God! He is no respector of persons! These planets cover these great distances with such accuracy that we set our watch by them! Isn't it a shame that we are not as dependable as the planets? Man, God's greatest work, has caused him mostly grief and has become unpredictable in all ages! With three and one-half billion others to watch over, surely God does not think any one person is more important than any other person. In a hundred years from now, hardly a soul now living will be on this planet alive! Others will be in full charge, those yet unborn!
