Practicing Christianity

From a recent survey it was learned that approximately 2,300 homeless children are being cared for by members of the church. The larger part of these live in about 50 children's homes scattered over sixteen states and Mexico. This figure does not include those who are in foster homes or who have been adopted by Christian couples. In regard to adoptions the Tennessee Children's Home has placed about 1,000 in the past few years, the Children's Home of Lubbock places about 75 each year, Christ Haven has placed 165 since 1960, Turley Home has placed 27 with Christian Homes of Abilene placing 52 during the past year and the New Mexico Children's Home, 13.

Many others have no doubt been placed by other homes and agencies of which we have no record. From the same survey it is estimated that there are three hundred or more in foster homes.

The above facts plus the beginning of several new plans for child care are very heartening. Our hats are off to the many who have labored so diligently to make this possible. These really believe in

the practice of "pure religion" but their number is far too few. Every child of God needs to be involved in the work of benevolence.

The touching story of the good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37) centers around helping the needy and illustrates how that two who feigned religion refused to get involved and "passed by on the other side." During the past year or so it has been reported that on the basis of the number of members of the church and the number of homeless children being cared for it takes 1,235 members of the churches of Christ to care for one child. If this be anywhere near correct, comparatively few of us are involved. It seems that some are willing to give a pittance or hand-medowns but don't really want to get involved.

One way of really getting involved is via the foster home plan. I do not pose as an authority; however, after being involved for the past year with the Maude Carpenter Home and one of their children, we recommend it. (Many others have been involved much longer.) Just as it cost the Samaritan something to care for the unfortunate man, it will cost one something to bring a foster child into his home, that which costs nothing however is worth little. Getting involved with a foster child will cost one sleep, convenience, possibly some luxuiries and money. There will be wear and tear on the nerves and emotions. One will cry with and for them. It will mean repeated school conferences, extra trips to the doctor, dentist, etc.; however, there are definite rewards which begin immediately. It is sheer music to hear them tell you they love you or thank God for their homes, parents, etc. Too, one learns greater unselfishness. patience and the art of truly giving of one's self. One's own children learn what it means to share and to love. It is worth so much more than the few worldly possessions or pleasures one has to deny themselves or their own children. As one sees them grow spiritually, physically, socially and mentally he is thankful to God for the privilege of helping one of HIS LIT-

TLE ONES. Foster parents can also be encouraged in the fact that they are truly practicing Christianity and laying up treasures in Heaven. True enough, it isn't easy but where did we get the idea that prighten our pathway in this world of darkness, it only can keep us from taking this first wrong step.

"The First Wrong Step"

In the first Psalm of David, we have a picture of how man's life gets out of harmony with God. This Psalm presents the same warning which Jesus taught in Mat. 7:13, 14. Our Lord warns against entering the wide gate and the broad way, whereas David speaks more about how this way is entered. "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful". The word, counsel, as used here refers to advice, thus walking in, or accepting the advice of the ungodly. This is the first wrong step in man's departure from God's way. In Prov. 1: 10, 15 the wide man wrote, "My son, if sinners entice thee, consent thou not. My son, walk not thou in the way with them; refrain thy foot from their path;" How desperately our youth needs this advice today. How they need to be warned and guided to keep from taking this first step.

Walking in the counsel of the ungodly many appear in a number of ways, but to be sure, it will present itself in a most innocent form. Choosing the wrong friends and companions is often an influence into this way. "Be not deceived; evil communications corrupt good manners" 1 Cor. 15:33. This simply suggests that evil friends will corrupt good morals. So often our young people are forced to choose friends which are not christians. We can have friends which are not Christians, but care must be exercised in choosing them. Too many times christian boys and girls are enticed by their worldy friends to take this first wrong step. They are offered their cigarette, the first step to an expensive habit which makes them a slave. The first drink, just socially, one can't hurt you, but whe re does it lead? The first dance, so innocent; will it ever become indecent, Will it ever come under the sinful heading of lasciviousness? Will the friends we choose ever force us into a situation where we must act and dress indecently? Parents owe it to their children to help them maintain the purity which is constantly threatened. Parents should know the type of friends their children have this may prevent much heartache for their children.

"It can't happen to me", this is only the voice of encouragement to take that first step. The apostel Peter was confident that he could not deny his Lord, no doubt he considered this an utter impossibility. But notice, he just wanted to warm himself by the fire which the enemies of Jesus had built, but at this fire he was forced into an embarrassing situation. Peter did not intend for things to happen as they did, for had he done so, he no doubt would have never come near the fire. Young people never plan to go as far as they do, they have confidence they can stop things before they get out of hand. The tragic thing is, as long as they believe they can stop they don't want to.

The counsel of the ungoldly also persuades church members to become unfaithful. This advice suggest to them that all the church assemblies are not important, as long as they get to services on Sunday morning in time to take the Lord's supper this is all that is important. Where does the bible teach that the Lord's supper is more important than any other act of worship? They convince themselves that studying the bible is for the preacher, and that prayer is just a waste of time. Many believe they have hired the preacher to do their work for them. It seems that many have concluded that all they have to do to reach heaven is to be baptized and take the Lord's supper. If these thoughts have hammered at your consience it would be wise to consider the source of such information. This is the counsel of the ungodly speaking to your consieence. There is a need to practice the Lord's statement of Mat. 16: 23 "Get thee behind me. Satan; thou art an offense unto me; for thou savourest not the things that be of God, but those that be of men".

How can we keep from taking this first dangerous step? Let God's word be the meditation of our heart day and night. Hide it in our heart that we might not sin against God. Only God's word can brighten our pathway in this world of darkness, it only can keep us from taking this first wrong step.

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
