Unity ...

Today it is said that we have near three hundred different kinds of churches in the United States alone, and estimated to be near two thousand throughout the world! Yet Jesus promised to build only one church (His church) Matt. 16:18. The Bible states that He (Jesus) purchased the (one) church with His own BLOOD, Acts 20:28. There is "ONE BODY" (Eph. 4:4) and this one body is "THE CHURCH", Col. 1:18, so there is ONE church which the Lord established. The Lord "adds" all those "who should be saved" to the church, not one of the more than two hundred churches in the United States! ALL THE SAVED WERE IN FELLOWSHIP (Acts 2:42), not joining hundreds of churches teaching conflicting doctrines, contrary to the word of God. Now man "joins the church of his choice". In New Testament times, you could not, neither now can you "join" the Lord's church. On the contrary, the LORD ADDED THOSE "WHO SHOULD BE SAVED" TO THE CHURCH OF HIS CHOICE. The ONE HE PURCHASED WITH HIS OWN BLOOD! Now a man "thinks" he is saved and then looks for a human governed religious group to join. One which believes what he ALREADY believes. But the Lord makes no mistakes, those who OBEY HIM to become Christians, He adds to the "called out", or the church. Yes, today if EVERY person would obey Christ, every person would be "added", by the Lord, ot His church and there would be ONE church and ALL would be in fellowship and we would have the

Dividends on Our Religion

Average Religion . . .

Too many people in all religions today, are not really sold on what they are doing. Most have simply "joined" the family religion as that is what was expected of them. Still others are sprinkled into some religion and the father and mother promised to see that they are married in the church and buried in the church cemetery. This keeps the family respectable as far as a church is concerned. But this is not New Testament Christianity.

Must Make Investment . . .

It is rather trite, but still true, that we are only interested in that in which we have an investment. Jesus said that the heart is where ever our treasure is. In New Testament times the Christian "first gave himself" to the Lord, II Cor. 8:5. They realized that the Lord had "bought them", I Cor. 6:19-20. In view of thoese two facts it was simple, logical and natural to "present one's body" to God as a "living sacrifice, holy and acceptable" to God. This was to be a "reasonable", or "spiritual" service, Rom. 12:1. Now when a person has committed himself completely unto God, it is not a burden, but a pleasure, to look after one's investment. When we put both heart and treasure into the hands of God, we can say with Paul, "I am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him", II Tim. 1:12. ARE YOU NOW DRAWING ANY DIVIDENDS BECAUSE YOU HAVE MADE NO INVESTMENTS???

COOPERATION

A traveler found his path blocked by an immense rock in a precipitous ravine. No matter how much he exerted himself, he still could not move the boulder. He sat down in helpless despair. Soon another traveler came along the same road. He, too, tried to move the rock, but failed as had the first. After several hours had passed, suddenly one of the men thought of a way, and asked, "Might we not succeed together where we have failed alone?" Then, before their united strength, the barrier yielded and left the way open. We need this lesson. There is strength in unity. Christians must work together if they expect to successfully fulfill the Great Commission of Christ. (Mark 16:15,16).

By Faith Abel Offered...

From Heb. 11:4, we learned that Abel "offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain", and that God accepted Abel's offering and rejected Cain's offering. This was all done by FAITH! Faith comes only by "hearing the word of God", Rom. 10:17, so this means to do something "by faith" it must have been commanded by God. Where God has NOT commanded ANYTHING. then to engage in such can NOT be by faith! Without faith we can NOT please God, Heb. 11:6. We WALK by faith and NOT by sight, 2 Cor. 5:7. This again means that ALL we do to worship God, must have been COMMANDED by Him, or else it is NOT of faith and can not please God.

Cain may have been honest and sincere, just as much as Abel, yet God rejected his sacrifice, because it was NOT of faith, meaning that God had NOT commanded the KIND of sacrifice Cain offered. Now God did not tell Cain NOT to offer the fruit of the field, but in stating the KIND of sacrifice he did want, this excluded EVERY OTHER kind of sacrifice in the world! God ONLY has to state what he wants, he does not then have to go through hundreds of other things stating not this, or not that. When he told Noah to build the ark of gopher wood, this at the same time excluded all other types of wood!

BEAUTY ONLY IN THE EYE OF THE BEHOLDER?

"People are composed of girls and boys also men and women. Boys are no good at all until they grow up and get married. Men who don't get married are no good either. Boys are an awful bother. Isn't this all of us seen through the eyes of a little girl? Yet how small so many people look through "small eyes."

A Man Who Happens to be Blind

There were those who were physically blind recorded in the Bible (Matt. 9:27; Mark 10:46) and those who were spiritually blind (Matt. 23:16 and 15:14.) Most of our writing concerns those in spiritual darkness, but at this time I want to speak a word in behalf of those who "happen to be blind" from a physical stand point. I have for many years contributed to the National Federation of the Blind and have been deeply interested in those who must walk in physical darkness. Not sympathy, but profound respect and great admiration. Though they see not through the natural eye, they truly "see". more of real life than most of us. As most of us have friends or relatives who fall in this group, I want to share with you some "do's and don'ts" provided by the National Federation of the Blind. .

- 1. I'm an ordinary person, just blind. Don't shout, or address me as if I were a child. Don't ask my wife, "Does he take cream in his coffee?" Ask me.
- 2. I can walk more easily with you than with a dog or cane. Don't grab my arm; let me take yours. I'll keep a half-step behind, to anticipate curbs and steps. Going down stairs I perfer to hold the railing.
- 3. I want to know who's in the room with me. Speak when you enter. Introduce me to others. Include children, and tell me if there's a cat or dog. Guide my hand to a chair, and show me the ashtray.
- 4. The door of a room or car left ajar is a hazard for me. So are toys on the floor. Watch out for projecting lamp-shades; I hate to break things.
- 5. At dinner I may ask help to cut meat. Tell me where the food is on my plate. "Meat at nine o'clock; peas at two o'clock"; potatoes at four."

6. Don't avoid words like "see." I use them too. I'm always glad to see you.

- 7. I don't want pity. But don't talk about the wonderful compensation of blindness. Whatever I've learned has been the hard way.
- 8. If I'm your houseguest, show me the bathroom, closet, dresser, window, the outlet for my electric razor. The light switch, too; I like to know whether the lights are on.
- 9. I'll discuss blindness with you if you're curious, but it's an old story to me. I have as many other interest as you do.

unity Paul demanded, Christ prayed for, and the early New Testament church HAD! The same doctrine taught and obeyed today would produce the same unity which would produce the same rapid growth! ARE YOU WILLING TO FIRST HAVE UNITY WITH THE LORD THEN TEACH ALL MEN TO UNITE WITH YOU ARE YOU UNITE WITH THE LORD? DO YOU KNOW OF A BETTER WAY THAN THE WAY OF THE LORD? HE SAYS HE IS THE WAY, John 14:6. THEN WHY NOT WALK IN THE LORD'S WAY?

The Apostles' Doctrine Was Their Standard of Authority . .

"They continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine", Acts 2:42. In every business, government, or religion, there must be some standard of authority. There must be a final authority to which all may turn to have unity of operation. Today most religions find this in the authority of creeds written by men, or in the traditions of men. When modern generations no longer like the existing creeds, or traditions, they have the authority to add to them, take away from them, or change them to fit the thinking and desires of the present generation. So really in most religions, the final authority or standard in religion is what the majority or hierarchy, wants to do in each religion. The creeds are "kept up to date", by changing them to meet the wishes of the present generation. Instead of men changing to fit the requirement of the creeds, the creeds are changed to fit the wishes of the people! Now in the New Testament church, past, present and future, men are "born again" by this doctrine and repent, or conform to the requirements of God. When there was a misunderstanding, or error brought into the church, the inspired word was still in the inspired apostles and had not been written into what is now the New Testament. SO TO THE APOSTLES WENT THE CHURCH MEMBERS, AND WHEN THE APOSTLES SPOKE THE MATTER WAS SETTLED ONCE AND FOR ALL (ACTS 15). GVP

By Faith Noah Moved...

"By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith", Heb. 11:7.

Did Noah's "moving" and "preparing" an ark, VOID his salvation as being "by faith"? NO, it was ONLY when faith MOVED him that his faith was acceptable to God! Faith WITHOUT works (moving and preparing on the part of Noah) is DEAD, James 2:24. From this verse and the account in Gen. 6:3-18, we learn that Noah was Devinely admonished concerning the coming of the flood, and advised to go to work to prepare an ark to SAVE HIMSELF, and that no doubt that he had 120 years to prepare for the flood.

Just BELIEVING that the flood WOULD come and that God was ABLE AND WILLING to save him was not enough! Noah had something to DO to SAVE HIMSELF, he had to MOVE AND PREPARE his OWN ARK! No man can BELIEVE God and NOT do what God COMMANDS him to do! The time of salvation was far in the future, there was no natural sign to confirm the possibility of a flood and the "reasoning" of man was aginst such an event! YET, NOAH BELIEVED GOD, MOVED AND PREPARED AN ARK; ALL THIS WAS DONE "BY FAITH".

The wicked scoffed and did not believe it necessary to "move and prepare" no doubt many "believed" (?) in God, as millions today "believe in Christ" (?), yet they refused to "move and prepare" as millions today refuse to obey God, because this would make their salvation only by "works". There is no such thing as "faith without works", for no faith is acceptable to God, until the faith is strong enough to "move" the person to OBEY Christ, Heb. 5:9, James 2:26. Read it for yourself! Millions are "believing" themselves to heaven, but this is impossible!

If We Could Tune In...

If it were possible for everyone to look into the heart of a dedicated Bible school teacher, or hear some of the earnest pleas such teachers make before the throne of God, NO ONE would miss Bible school wilfully.

In the August, '66 issue of Church School Worker, Lodene B. Hathaway wrote this meditation/prayer of a Bible school teacher. This is typical of what we would hear if we could tune in:

"Here I sit, Father, with some tools in my hands—tools that will help to reveal you to young minds: A Bible, a teacher's coursebook, a student's book, and some references. I will need, too, some ideas of my own, if I am to meet the particular needs of these young individuals. The weeks ahead look so long, with so many hours of study, so many Sunday mornings of racing to make an early class hour, yet so little time to try to introduce the young people to all that is here.

"I've failed so many times, Father — failed to reach them with the vital points; failed to bring them to the place where you can meet them, and where they can begin to grasp the magnificence and power of being part of your love and concern.

"Yet I cannot quit, Lord. To do this woul; deny me an opportunity for my own spiritual growth, because every hour spent with these texts is a face to face confrontation with you. To stop now would deny me the singular experience of hours spent with great minds who have conceived these texts and recorded these scriptures; who have searched and found you, and then placed their findings before those of us who follow, seeking.

"Somehow, Father, I feel that you know all this. Somehow, sitting here with a whole new semester stretching before me, I feel that I will not be alone through the weeks that loom so long and difficult.

"Here is my hand, Father: Walk with me. We have a job to do! Amen."

Luke - - Alone

2 TIM. 2:11

These two words open the pages to the most absorbing story. They find the apostle Paul in a Roman dungeon awaiting the touch of the heathen blade that will signal his departure from this life into the next. He had said to Phil. 1, "This is far better for me—to go and be with the Lord." Yet, death will always parade it's fears and uncertainities—especially in such as case as Paul's. You see, he faced death at the hands of Roman executioners.

The prospect of dying became more and more frightening with the departure of his "friends". Writing the second letter to Timothy, desperately urging him to come, Paul said, "You are aware that all in Asia turned away from me..." 2 Tim. 1:15. "Do your best to come soon. For Demas, in love with this present world, has deserted me and gone to Thessalonica; Crescens has gone to Galatia, Titus to Dalmatia." Just here—Paul offers the words of our text: "Luke—alone is with me." We begin to see how very deep, the meaning of these two words—Luke alone!

Now Luke was a very important man. He was a physician and could have been as wealthy as he might have chosen, yet here he is, standing by as a faithful friend to the condemned apostle. Those were dangerous times and such loyalty might well have cost him his own life. Reading the two great books that he wrote, Luke and Acts, it seems likely the Jews would have welcomes his death, yet he had the faith and courage to be there when Paul needed him most. How touching these two words become, "Luke alone is with me."

Have you ever considered that in a given moment, facing a specific need, you alone may be left to carry out Heaven's wishes? There are ever so many things that will depend on you alone. Aren't you thankful that Luke was willing to stand alone when our beloved brother, Paul needed him so? At the same time, don't you just know that Jesus must be proud of you when you prove that you are willing to take your place as a solitary sentury by his side?
