CRISIS CONTROL

Crises come in different sizes, just like people, but inevitably they will come.

A child will fail his grade of face a tonsillectomy. The family will suffer a death, the serious illness of one child or the loss of faith by an older one. These are real crises. They really hurt.

A group of mental health experts from Harvard University led by Dr. Gerald Caplan studied individual reactions to crises for several years. Their recommendations to those who would help are in keeping with the New Testament principles.

The most significant finding was that another person can be of substantial help in times of crisis. The type of help one receives determines the outcome more than his previous disposition and training. Though someone may be informed thoroughly on how to handle crises, when crisis comes comes he is disoriented. He needs someone to help him find the way. Paul admonishes "Bear one another's burdens."

In this context, expecially, a little sometimes goes a long way. The scales can be tipped to a favorable balance sometimes by just a few words of comfort. Paul admonishes "Comfort one another with these words."

The person in crisis cannot be helped by the Polyanna expression "Everything will be all right"! Loved ones who are seriously ill just may die and the family knows it. Rather than try to hide the seriousness of the situation it is much better to help people to face the reality of this crises. Those who face up to their anguish and loss are better able to bear it. Help them to realize that they do need the help of their friends and especially of God. Paul admonishes "Weep with them that weep; rejoice with those that rejoice."

One person enters the home racked with sorrow and says "If there is anything I can do..." Another comes and asks "Where do you keep your broom?" The matter-of-fact business of relieving the bereaved of everyday tasks is a great source of comfort and strength of them.

Crisis removal is many times impossible. However, crisis control is possible for those who practice the principles of the compassionate Savior who wept at the tomb of His friend.

I don't believe in mixed swimming. My husband and I usually are alone, or perhaps my parents are along when we water ski or fish. What is your thinking on this? —J.J.R., Calif."

We live in an age of few restraints. Nudity or near nudity surrounds us on the street, in the supermarkets, and especially on the TV screen. Therefore I find it refreshing to find one who is willing to pause and question the practice. The writer states she has been a loyal Christian only three years. Would that we could get those who are older in the faith

to soberly consider this also. Modest apparel today is the same as modest apparel since Adam and Eve sewed fig leaves! Modesty is always modesty. To be sure, the mode or fashions may change. But modesty is always chaste, discreet, and pure. And the modest lady extends no open invitation to ogle and lust, for she considers herself more then "wolf-bait," and revels not in suggestive whistles from men she may seduce. Modesty is defined as (a) the sense of propiety; (b) the absence of anything suggestive of sexual impurity; decency, chastity; purity of manners (Webster). Even though the style of women's clothes may change, the Christian woman will be modest in safeguarding her reputation by decorous attire and behavior.

It was the nakedness of Bath-Sheba that was the cause of David's great sin. A Christian woman will remember this in selecting her wearing apparel on any occasion. Paul's stated desire was "that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety." (1 Tim. 2:9). The modern bather sees little spiritual instruction in the words of our Lord: "Blessed is he that watcheth, and keepeth his garments, lest he walk naked and they see his

The Foolish Act of a Wicked King

In the thirty-sixth chapter of Jeremiah there is an account of a most unusual event. It concerned a scroll, or book, which the prophet Jeremiah had dictated to Baruch, a scribe. It contained a message from God to the people of Judah who were drifting from serving him as he desired. The message warned that if they did not repent much evil would come upon the nation.

When the king of Judah, Jehoiakim, heard of the message of God that had been written on the scroll he asked that it be brought and read in his presence. The wenty-second verse of this chapter tells us that it was in the winter season and that a fire was burning on the hearth as Jehudi brought in the scroll and started to read to the king. When three or four pages had been read the king took the scroll from the one who was reading and took a pen knife and cut the scroll into shreads and threw the remains into the fire where it was consumed. He did not like what was in the message and showed his contempt by throwing it into the fire.

Great numbers of people have shown the same attitude toward the word of God from that time till the present. No, not many use the knife and fire method of opposing what the Bible teaches, but use other methods which accomplish the same results. This may be done in many ways. "I don't care what the Bible says, I am going to do as I please." "I don't believe the Bible is inspired." Attitudes like those destroys the respect and reverence that is necessary for one to have toward the teachings in the Bible. Others never study the Bible and are so indifferent toward the message found therein, they might as well burn the book from their presence as they have no interest in what it says.

What were the results of the foolish acts of the king? Jeremiah was informed that the wrath of God would be visited upon the king and the people in his kingdom. The last verse of the chapter tells of Jeremiah taking another roll and giving it to the scribe, Baruch, telling him to write all the message contained in the first book and that there would be many like words added.

The lesson to all is plain. Man cannot destroy the word of God. If we do not accept this word it will destroy us. A short time later the entire nation of Judah was carried into captivity because they would not repent and turn back to God. They refused to heed the prophets who spoke for God and plead for them to accept his will.

What Shall I Do?

Will We Know One Another in Heaven?

I would like to make a few observations about the above question. Jesus said, "that many shall come from the east and the west, and shall set down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of Heaven" (Matt. 8:11). This passage, though not necessarily intending to, reveals the fact that Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, will retain their personalities of this life, in the next life. Let us ask the question: "Will we know one another in Hell?" Of course no one wants to go to Hell, so, let us re-word the question: "Will we know one another in Hadees?" No one will be exempt from the Hadean tenure, unless of course you are still living upon the Earth then the Lord comes. The question is, therefore germane to the issue at hand. The passage that I would suggest for your further consideration is Luke 16:19-31. From this reading one can determine several factors about the next life. There are some who would tell us that this reading is parabolic and therefore, does not mean what it says. The reading being parabolic may very well be; who knows for a certainty? Parabolic or not, the reading is truth. Who would accuse Christ of telling untruths? Therefore, the teaching of Luke 16 is truth, parabolic or not! We learn from the reading that two men lived and two men died and that their existence in the next life was exactly opposite as it was in this life (Lk. 16:19-22). In the next life, we will have eyes and be able to recognize (Lk. 16:23); we will be able to talk (24, 25); we will have fingers (24); we will have the ability to know comforts and blessings (24, 25); we will be able to remember (25-28). This passage, to say the least, is challenging.

One last comment. What if we are not able to have any future recognition of "know-ability"? That would mean many more difficulties for us in the next life. We would not know where we were or why we were there. We would not know God, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, or any one. We would only know ourselves. Although, if there is no future recognition, how do we "un-do" the dilemma of possibly not recognizing ourselves? However, it is pleasing to know that on the mount of Transfiguration Moses and Elijah appeared to Peter,

The New Testament Church cared for those in "need" only, Acts 2:45; 4:35. Please read these scriptures! It was according to "need", no one was "owed" anything and there were no parasites! No work, no eat!

ANY ONE MAY STAND IN NEED OF HELP SOMETIMES, BUT NOT ALL THE TIME

Any person may find himself in circumstance sometime in life, where his obligations are greater than he can carry, but to make a "career" out of charity, is something that God condemns! God gave certain conditions which should be met even for "widows" whom the church could support. So it is easy to understand if not all widows could receive support, certainly able bodied men are not to become parasites!

WHEN SHOULD A WIDOW BE SUPPORTED?

First, if a needy widow had children, or nephews; they were to care for her needs! If she had neither the church could support her, if she met the following conditions; she must be over 60 vears of age, having been the wife of one husband, reared children and done good works, 1 Tim. 5:3-10. shame." (Rev. 16:15). The modern bather sees no shame in parading nakedness. More and more publicity is given to shows where performers appear completely nude. They openly parade their shame as their glory, and seem to have nothing else to offer the world. Can Christians sanction such gross behavior by trying to walk in their steps? Can we in any way patronize those who boast of their "sex appeal"?

Ordinarily the whole concept of this "mixed bathing" is only a guise which the shameless wear as an opportunity to preen before the lustful and adulterous eyes of the opposite sex, who ogle and lust for what is either seen or suggested.

As I have written to mothers, "If you don't want indecent men casting indecent looks at your daughter, don't let her parade about indecently."

The wearing of shorts, capris, bathing suits, or flimsiest negligee may be proper attire in the right time and place, and seen by the right one. But the women who leads any man to lust after her, save her own husband, thereby commits sin. A woman is responsible for the evil thoughts in the mind of all men if she has placed the thoughts there. It is not my place to tell women what they should or should not wear. It is my responsibility to warn you that you are your brother's keeper.
