The apostle Paul said in the first three verses of the tenth chapter of the letter to the saints in Rome, "Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God. but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted thems lves unto the righteousness of though they were a zealous people, they were worshipping God ignorantly. Baptism: As Taught in the Bible Lemuel Martin--Welcome Hill

When the Lord commanded men to be baptized did he command a thing that was unreasonable or that cannot be done? If the Lord commanded it, why do men say it is not necessary.
