WHAT DOES A PREACHER DO WITH ALL HIS TIME?

He spends long hours with a telephone receiver to his ear, listening to the troubles

of others. Quite often when he should be sleeping, he lies awake and wonders about certain "sheep" who stray and have poor appetites. He must care for people who don't care for themselves. Many times he is in prayer for those who went to sleep without saying their prayers. In between times, he prepares and delivers several sermons and teaches classes.

One of his fellow ministers put it like this: "Have you ever tried preaching over a hundred different sermons to the same audience each year? Have you ever tried leading a prayer meeting service, week after the congregation was absent? Have you ever spent hours on hours preparing a sermon and exhausted all the energy in your body delivering it and then felt as if few appreciated it and fewer profited by it? Have you ever tried to love when others hate-or praise when others condemn? Have you ever tried to bind up broken hearts when yours was ed and the dregs of remorse left.

The church of the Lord Jesus Christ has a platform. That platform is the one in which all men ought to be interested above all others. The platform of the church is not. her creed. The word "creed" simply means "I believe". Christ is the creed of the New Testament church. This being true, what then is the platform of the church? In general the New Testament as a whole is it's platform. But let us be more specific. Let us read-

We have thus far seen Jomewhat of the essentiality of the bonds of unity in the Christian platform. We are now ready to consider baptism as one of the planks in our platform. Baptism is one of the most hated commands of our Lord. This "one baptism" is not Holy Spirit baptism. but rather, the baptism of the Great Commission. It is the baptism that is to be administered "in the name of Jesus Christ", (By his authority) Acts 2:38) "into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matt. 28:19, R. V.) Thus, we see there is no such thing as one being baptized "in the name of Jesus only." This baptism is "for the remission of sins." (Acts 2:38). It saves now. (I Pet. 3:21). Our sins are washed away by the blood of Christ (Heb. 9:14) in baptism. (Acts 22:16).

ONE GOD

The last and final plank in our platform is the "one God". He is the Eternal One. (Psa. 90:1-2). In him we live and move and have our being. (Acts 17:28). It is a wonderful thought to know that it is in God that we have our very existence and spiritual being. With out him we are nothing.
